









Objectives

- Acquiring specialised knowledge in Maritime Law, with the latest legal and jurisprudential updates, as well as all the international tools applicable to the day-to-day of the legal and economic aspects of the maritime sector, by offering a practical and solid view of these legal and economic aspects from the Anglo-Saxon Law perspective.

and methodology

Modules that are taught in this master's degree in Maritime Law respond to the students' need to acquire an integrating and systematic training of skills to use in international maritime law and business.

The methodology combines theoretical lectures with practical development of cases and real situations in group, for further discussion in class. We use the case method, simulations,

coursework presentations in class, etc., constantly using information technologies to facilitate the learning process.

The master's degree offers several practical sessions, workshops and visits to various institutions — for instance, a sailing tour within the Port of Barcelona waters or a guided visit through the BEST facilities, a port terminal property of Hutchinson Ports.

What is more, students will take part in the **European Port Experience**, a four-day study trip to the Rotterdam Port (in the world's top 10 of important ports) and to its counterparts in Hamburg and Barcelona, classified among the most relevant in Europe, with on-site classes by its managers.

Lectures in Maritime Law of England and Wales will be taught in English by professors of The City Law School University in London.

Duration

The Master's Degree contemplates the realisation of 60 ECTS credits.

The theoretical areas can be taken separately, and for the credits that each one of them consists of, students can obtain a university extension certificate or specialist title in the corresponding subjects.

Calendar

From October to July.

Tipology and Schedule

The type of education of the Master's Degree in Maritime Law is blended learning, with compulsory on-site sessions, on Fridays from 4.00 pm to 8.00 pm. Students will also receive personalised attention through computer tools (CampusNet), all year long.

Students will have to carry out the area of projects, for which they will have at their disposal the counselling of tutors, who will help them in their realisation. For those students who hand in a business plan, the Master's management will consider the possibility of starting it up by negotiating with financial institutions for obtaining a microcredit.

Price of the Master's Degree

€ 5,955

Payment methods

Admitted candidates on the ordinary period must make a place reservation by paying € 1,200, to be discounted from the total amount of the price. Once a place has been reserved on the course, the remaining fee can be paid in the following ways:

- **Single Payment.** This method involves a 3% enrolment fee discount
- **Instalment Payment.** 50% at the time of the enrolment and 50% in January
- **Monthly Payment.** 10 instalments with special financing at 0% interest with Banc de Sabadell (Consult arrangement fee)
- **Other Payment methods** with Banco Santander, "la Caixa", Banc Sabadell, Catalunya Caixa and BBVA. It also involves a 3% enrolment fee discount

Study grants

Postgraduate study grants programme: academic merits scholarships, grants for personal and economic circumstances, and special conditions with financial entities. Endowments range from 10% to 30% of the total price of the programme.

This postgraduate degree fulfils the requirements to be reimbursed by means of the Fundació Tripartita. Please check with the Student Attention Service when formalising the enrolment process.

International students can apply for scholarships of the International Early Enrolment programme, which grant access to discounts on the postgraduate enrolment fee.

The Agency of Management of Research and University Grants (AGAUR) of the Generalitat de Catalunya also offers preferential loans for enrolment fees.



Admission process

1 Admission application

The candidate must fill out the Admission Application in the website of the University. The regular place application period ends in July, and the extraordinary in September.

The Information and Admission Service will notify the candidates of the status of their application. However, it is every student's own responsibility to make sure that all documents are sent ahead of time.

2 Interview

The Admission Committee evaluates applications and, as a part of the process, has a personal interview with the candidate, in which they assess the following criteria: academic transcript record, professional experience and complementary training.

3 Admission

The Admission Committee takes the final decision in an approximate period of 15 days since the moment in which the application is complete.

If the candidate is admitted, they receive admission credentials with instructions for completing the enrolment process. Admitted candidates in the ordinary process must reserve their place in the programme. Admission to the programme is valid only for the academic year in which the candidate issues their application.

If these studies do not reach a minimum of students enrolled, the University may cancel them. In the event of the cancellation of the studies, the students will be notified three weeks in advance.
